



ACADEMIC ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

*A.S. in Early Childhood Education at Berkshire Community College, and
A.A. in Early Childhood Education at Berkshire Community College Pittsfield, and
B.A. in Early Care and Education Program at Elms College, Chicopee, MA*

The above institutions hereby enter into an agreement for the transfer of Berkshire Community College graduates from the *Associate of Science (A.S.) Early Childhood Education* degree programs, both the cohort and career tracks, and the traditional *Associate of Arts (A.A.) Early Childhood Education* degree program and, into the Elms College *B.A in Early Care and Education* program in Pittsfield, MA.

Objectives of this Agreement:

1. To provide informational materials and guidelines to Berkshire Community College students considering enrollment in the Elms College Early Care and Education degree completion programs.
2. To attract qualified students from Berkshire Community College to the off-site degree completion early care and education program at Elms College.
3. To promote a seamless transition for students in the Berkshire Community College's Associate degree programs in early childhood education to the Elms College baccalaureate degree completion program in early care and education.

Stipulations of this Agreement:

1. This articulation agreement will be in effect for five years and will be renewable for another five years by consent of Berkshire Community College and Elms College. This articulation agreement can be reviewed within 90 days after written notice by either party.
2. Elms College provides the opportunity for students to complete their early care and education bachelor degree program within two years from the date of enrollment.
3. This articulation agreement will be in force, and should be considered the entire agreement, until superseded by a formal contract between Elms College and Berkshire Community College that explicitly replaces this agreement.
4. This agreement will apply to Berkshire Community College transfer students who have completed an associate degree. At the time of application, students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.0.



5. This agreement provides the opportunity for students who earn an associate degree in *early childhood education* at Berkshire Community College and met Elms College admission requirements to enter the Elms College Bachelor of Arts in early care and education program with at least 60 transfer credits. All courses taken to satisfy major requirements must meet the standards set by the Division of Education at Elms College and its accrediting body.
6. Transfer students previously designated will hold third year status in the Elms College bachelor degree completion programs in early care and education at Berkshire Community College based on the number of credits accepted in transfer.
7. BCC students who transfer to the Elms College off campus early care and education program at Berkshire Community College may transfer up to a maximum of 78 credits from Berkshire Community College towards a bachelor degree.
8. Berkshire Community College students receive transfer credit for satisfactorily completing Elms College core requirements and equivalent early care and education program requirements up to 78 credits.

Review and Revision Procedures:

1. Review of this agreement shall take place at least every five years or as needed from the date of the signed agreement. The chair of the education division at Elms College and the early childhood education program advisor at Berkshire Community College will be responsible for the review.
2. At the request of either party, a review of the contents or implementation of this agreement will be conducted by the programs. The chair of the education division at Elms College and the early childhood education program advisor at Berkshire Community College may make changes in the attached course sequences and lists of courses accepted for Elms transfer credit without renegotiating the entire agreement.

Mutual Responsibilities:

1. Berkshire Community College and Elms College will list this articulation agreement on their websites and in appropriate print documents at their respective institutions.
2. The early childhood education program advisor at BCC will advise students enrolled in the A.A. and A.S. degrees in early childhood education at BCC. The attached BCC program sequences and list of courses accepted for Elms College transfer credit assure maximum



transfer of credits that meet the core requirements of Elms College and early care and education program requirements.

3. The coordinator of transfer affairs/articulation at Berkshire Community College along with the Elms College assistant director for off campus programs or her designee will advise and assist transfer applicants in compiling the required credentials for transfer to the Elms College early care and education programs.
4. Transfer applicants from Berkshire Community College who apply under this agreement shall be eligible for Elms College financial aid.
5. The final Elms College acceptance of degree completion applicants comes from, the dean of the School of Graduate and Professional Studies at Elms College, Elizabeth Hukowicz.
