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ACADEMIC ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Human Services Program at Berkshire Community College, Pittsfield, MA

And

Social Work Program at Elms College, Chicopee, MA and Lee Middle and High School, Lee, MA

The above institutions hereby enter into an agreement for the transfer of Berkshire Community College human service graduates into the Elms College social work programs in Chicopee and Lee, MA.

Objectives of this Agreement:

1. To attract qualified students from Berkshire Community College to full-time, part-time, Weekend and off-site degree completion social work programs at Elms College.
2. To promote a seamless transition for students from Berkshire Community College's Human Services A.S. program to part-time or full-time status in the Elms College baccalaureate degree program in social work with sites in Chicopee and Lee, MA: Day Division (Chicopee); Weekend College (Chicopee); and, Elms in the Berkshires (Lee).
3. To promote a seamless transition for any associate's degree graduate from Berkshire Community College who meets the entry requirements and chooses to enroll in the Elms College baccalaureate degree program in social work with sites in Chicopee and Lee, MA: Day Division (Chicopee); Weekend College (Chicopee); and, Elms in the Berkshires (Lee).
4. To provide informational materials and guidelines to Berkshire Community College students considering enrollment in the Elms College baccalaureate degree program in social work in Chicopee and Lee, MA.

Stipulations of this Agreement:

1. This articulation agreement will be in effect for five years and will be renewable for another five years by consent of Berkshire Community College and Elms College. This articulation agreement can be reviewed within 90 days after written notice by either party. Elms College will ensure that students are allowed to complete the social work Bachelor's Degree Completion Program in Lee, MA within two years from the date the student begins the

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onsite program. This articulation agreement will be in force, and should be considered the entire agreement, until superseded by a formal contract between Elms College and Berkshire Community College that explicitly replaces this agreement.

2. This agreement will apply to Berkshire Community College transfer students who have completed the associate's degree. At the time of application, students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5.
3. Transfer students designated above will hold third year status in the Elms College baccalaureate degree programs in social work in Chicopee and Lee, MA based on the credits accepted in transfer.
4. Transfer students to the day or Weekend College social work programs at Elms College in Chicopee, MA transfer up to 75 credits from Berkshire Community College towards a bachelor's degree.
5. Transfer students to the Elms College social work degree completion program at Lee Middle and High School transfer up to 78 credits from Berkshire Community College towards a bachelor's degree. Berkshire Community College students satisfactorily complete Elms College core requirements and social work program requirements in place at the time of admission.

Review and Revision Procedures:

1. Review of this agreement shall take place at least every two years or as needed from the date of the signed agreement. The program director of the Elms College social work program and the program advisor for the Berkshire Community College human services A.S. program will be responsible for the review.
2. At the request of either party, a review of the contents or implementation of this agreement will be conducted by the programs.
3. The Elms College social work program director and the program advisor for the Berkshire Community College human services A.S. program may make changes in the attached course sequence and list of courses accepted for Elms transfer credit without renegotiating the entire agreement.

Assistance Provisions:

1. Berkshire Community College and Elms College will list the articulation agreement on their websites and in appropriate print documents at their respective institutions.

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2. Berkshire Community College and Elms College will collaborate in encouraging qualified students to participate in the social work programs in Chicopee and Lee by providing the necessary assistance and supports to assure a seamless transition between the two institutions.

Mutual Responsibilities:

1. The Berkshire Community College human services program advisor will advise prospective transfer students according to the attached course sequence and list of courses accepted for Elms College transfer credit, which assures maximum transfer of credits that meet the core requirements of Elms College and social work program requirements.
2. The Berkshire Community College and Elms College transfer counselors and the Elms College Assistant Director of Off-campus Programs or her designee will advise transfer applicants in compiling the required credentials for transfer to Elms College social work programs.
3. Transfer applicants from Berkshire Community College applying under this agreement shall be eligible for Elms College financial aid and housing consideration as appropriate to the selected social work program option.
4. The final acceptance of part-time and degree completion applicants comes from the Associate Academic Dean for Graduate Studies and Continuing Education at Elms College. The final acceptance of full-time applicants to the on-campus social work program comes from the Director of Admissions at Elms College.
